TNPSC BITS

- ❖ Indian astrophysicist Prahlad Chandra Agrawal has been awarded the COSPAR Harrie Massey Award 2024 at the 45th COSPAR Scientific Assembly in Busan, South Korea.
- ❖ Palakkad based Sri Kurumba Educational and Charitable Trust, has been honoured with the "Best Child and Women Development Initiatives of the Year 2024".
- ❖ Union govt announced the theme of India Mobile Congress (IMC) 2024 as "The Future is Now."
- ❖ The Indian men's national football team remained at 124th place in the latest FIFA rankings.
- ❖ The President of the European Commission, Ursula von der Leyen, was re-elected and will serve for another five years.
- * Rwanda's President Paul Kagame has been re-elected to a fourth term in office with more than 99 percent of the vote.

TAMIL NADU

Tamil Nadu Day 2024



❖ After Indian Independence on 15 August 1947, the Madras Presidency became the Madras Province.





- ❖ As a result of the States Reorganisation Act, 1956, the state's boundaries were re-organized following linguistic lines.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu was created on 1 November 1956 with the name Madras State.
- ❖ On July 18, 1967, a resolution moved by former Chief Minister C.N. Annadurai was adopted by the State Assembly to rename the then Madras Presidency as Tamil Nadu.

NATIONAL

India-Taiwan MRA for Organic Products

- ❖ An agreement between India and Taiwan to facilitate trade in organically-produced goods, including tea and medicinal plants, has come into force.
- ❖ The Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA) will ease the export of organic products by avoiding dual certifications.
- The implementing agencies for the MRA are India's Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) and Taiwan's Agriculture and Food Agency.



4th ICCPR Human Rights Review

- ❖ India successfully concluded its fourth periodic review by the UN Human Rights Committee under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR).
- ❖ The Committee reviews report of all countries by conducting periodic reviews and make observations and recommendations.





❖ India became a party to the ICCPR in 1979 and has undergone three such reviews so far, the last being in 1997.



INTERNATIONAL

UN Water Convention 2024



- ❖ Ivory Coast has joined the United Nations Water Convention, becoming the 10th African nation to do so.
- ❖ It is now the 53rd Party (country) to the 1992 UN Water Convention.






- ❖ This convention is also known as the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes.
- ❖ The Convention was initially established as a regional framework for the pan-European region.
- ❖ In 2016, it is opened to all UN Member States but India is not a Party to Convention.
- ❖ This Convention is a unique legally binding instrument promoting sustainable management of shared water resources, the implementation of the SDG, the prevention of conflicts, and the promotion of peace and regional integration.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

OJ 287 and Black Hole Pairs



- ❖ A new study carried out by a group of 32 scientists from 10 countries spotted the smaller black hole of a pair establishing the 'sight' of an orbiting blackhole for the first time.
- * Researchers have already confirmed the theory that there are two black holes at the centre of the four billion light years distant galaxy OJ 287.
- ❖ The galaxy called OJ 287 is located billion light years away.
- ❖ In 2021, Researchers also have found indirect evidence that a very massive black hole in OJ 287 is orbiting a giant black hole 100 times its size.


UNEP Foresight Report 2024

❖ Recently, the UNEP released a report titled "Navigating New Horizons: A Global Foresight Report on Planetary Health and Human Wellbeing, 2024".





- ❖ 85% of the 169 SDG targets are off track and 37% of the targets have shown no progress.
- ❖ Human activities are predicted to affect over 90% of land by 2050.
- ❖ Up to 46% of species may face extinction.
- ❖ Global temperatures are projected to rise 2.1-3.9°C by 2100.
- ❖ There are over 8.89 billion mobile subscriptions, with around 5.6 billion users owning a device.
- ❖ 1.5% of the global population is forcibly displaced, nearly double the number from a decade ago.
- ❖ Environmental migrants could be 25 million-1 billion by 2050.
- ❖ The global inequality is worsening, with the top 10% holding over 75% of wealth, while the bottom 50% own just 2%.



STATES

Geological Links with Gondwana Supercontinent

- ❖ Scientists unearthed new findings shedding light on an ancient link between the Indian subcontinent and Antarctica.
- ❖ Their research provides strong evidence of a collision between India and East Antarctica over a billion years ago.
- ❖ They uncovered a hidden ridge beneath the Darsi and Addanki regions of Andhra Pradesh.





❖ This ridge is attributed to the historic collision, suggesting a tilting of the Cuddapah basin towards the south.



PERSONALITIES, AWARDS, AND EVENTS

SVANidhi Scheme awards 2024



❖ Madhya Pradesh has secured the first place under the 'Best Performing State' category in the PM SVANidhi scheme.





- ❖ This micro-credit scheme for urban street vendors provides collateral-free loans up to Rs 50,000.
- ❖ Assam has been ranked second in the 'Best Performing States- Innovation and Best Practices Award' category.
- ❖ In the 'Best Performing ULBs Loan Performance with mega and million plus cities' category, the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has received the first place.
- ❖ It is followed by the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) and the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation.
- ❖ The awards in the National Urban Livelihood Mission (DAY-NULM) were also announced.
- ❖ Kerala tops the chart in the category of 'Systematic Progressive Analytical Real Time Ranking (SPARK)', followed by Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan.

IMPORTANT DAYS

CSIR - CRRI foundation Day 2024 - July 16



- ❖ The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research CSIR-Central Road Research Institute (CRRI) celebrated its 73rd Foundation Day.
- ❖ The idea for CRRI was first discussed at the 1943 conference of Chief Engineers in Nagpur, Maharashtra.





❖ It was later approved by the CSIR General Body in March 1950, under the guidance of Sir Shanti Swaroop Bhatnagar, on 16 July 1952.

MISCELLANEOUS

Bhojshala-Kamal Maula Mosque complex - Madhya Pradesh



- ❖ The Archaeological Survey of India submitted its scientific survey report on the disputed Bhojshala-Kamal Maula Mosque complex.
- ❖ The ASI report suggests that Bhojshala was once a significant educational center, established by King Bhoj.
- ❖ The Hindu community considers Bhojshala, a 11th-century monument, as a temple of Vagdevi (Goddess Saraswati).
- ❖ The Muslim side calls it Kamal Maula Mosque.
- ❖ For the last 21 years, the Hindus are allowed to worship in the Bhojshala while Muslims are allowed to offer namaz at the place.
- Sufi saint Maula Kamaluddin Chishti was a disciple of Nizamuddin Auliya.
- ❖ He preached here for around 40 years around 1291.
