TNPSC BITS

- India's Puja Tomar became the first mixed martial arts fighter from the country to win a bout at the Ultimate Fighting Championship (UFC), held at USA.
- The Centre appointed Vice Chief of Army Staff Lt Gen Upendra Dwivedi as the next Army Chief.
- The United Nations has designated 2025 as the 'International Year of Quantum Science and Technology'.
- The 8th edition of Japan India Maritime Exercise 24 (JIMEX 24) commenced at Yokosuka Japan.
- Vijaya Bharathi Sayani, a member of the National Human Rights Commission, has become the acting chairperson of the central body with effect from June 2.
- According to the Kantar BrandZ Most Valuable Global Brands Report 2024, Infosys (74th) has been ranked among the 100 most valuable brands in the world, for the third consecutive year.
 - TCS, Infosys, and Airtel from India are among the Top 100 list which is topped by Apple, Google, Microsoft and Amazon.
- The Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (Ficci) has appointed Jyoti Vij as its director general.
- ✤ GAIL has announced that it intends to set up 1500 KTA ethane cracker project at Ashta, district Sehore in Madhya Pradesh.
- Ariarne Titmus of Australia set a world record in the women's 200-meter freestyle by finishing in 1 minute, 52.23 seconds in the final, held at Australia.
- Malawi Vice President Saulos Chilima's plane had crashed in the Chikangawa mountain range of Malawi, killing ten people including him.


A Review of Village Government in India

- The Policy Research Working Paper titled 'Two Hundred and Fifty-Thousand Democracies: A Review of Village Government in India' was released by the World Bank Group.
- In 1992, the 73rd Amendment to the Indian Constitution created 250,000 village democracies (called Gram Panchayats) covering 800 million citizens.





- Panchayati Raj Institutions rely almost entirely on grants made by state and national authorities.
- On average, 0.67 Panchayat Secretaries per Gram Panchayat only available, with the number falling to 0.33 in states like Uttar Pradesh.
- The 73rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 1992 gave constitutional status to the PRIs and established a system of uniform structure, elections, reservations.



Biannual University Admissions



✤ The University Grants Commission (UGC) has allowed higher education institutions to admit students twice a year from 2024-25 academic session.





- Earlier regulations allowed students to be admitted only during July-August only.
- In 2023 the Commission has permitted biannual admissions under open and distance learning (ODL) and online modes in January and July during an academic year.

Visceral Leishmaniasis (VL) framework

- The World Health Organization (WHO) launched a new visceral leishmaniasis framework to guide to eradicate the disease in eastern Africa.
- Its targets include a 90 per cent reduction in VL incidence in the eastern Africa sub-region to fewer than 1,500 cases per year by 2030.
- It is called as kala-azar in Hindi, spreads through the bite of infected female sandflies and is endemic in 80 countries.
- In 2022, eastern Africa accounted for 73 per cent of global VL caseload, 50 per cent of which occurred in children aged under 15 years.
- ✤ Earlier, between 2004 and 2008, Bangladesh, India and Nepal collectively accounted for 70 per cent of the global caseload.
- In October 2023, WHO announced that Bangladesh had successfully eradicated VL – making it the first country in the world to achieve the landmark.

ENVIRONMENT

Record Olive Ridley hatchlings 2024

 Over 2 lakh Olive Ridley Sea turtle hatchlings were released into the sea during the nesting season from January to May in Tamil Nadu.






- ✤ This marks the highest number of hatchlings released from Tamil Nadu so far.
- The highest number of Olive Ridley hatchlings were released from Cuddalore (89,648), Nagapattinam (60,438), and Chennai (38,230) coasts.
- ✤ Across the State, as many as 28,971 turtles were found dead this season.



Nitrous Oxide Emitters 2024



- India is the world's second largest source of nitrous oxide (N_2O).
- $\clubsuit\ N_2O$ is a greenhouse gas that heats up the atmosphere far more than carbon dioxide.
- Nearly 11% of such global man-made emissions in 2020 were from India, topped only by China at 16%.
- ✤ The major source of these emissions comes from fertiliser usage.





- ✤ N₂O emissions from human activities have increased by 40% (three million metric tons of N₂O per year) in the past four decades.
- The top five country emitters by volume of anthropogenic N2O emissions in 2020 were China (16.7%), India (10.9%), the United States (5.7%), Brazil (5.3%), and Russia (4.6%).

REPORTS AND INDICES

Global Gender Gap Index 2024

- ✤ The World Economic Forum's released the Global Gender Gap Index 2024.
- India saw a drop of two positions, now ranking 129th out of 146 countries in the Index.
- The index ranked India's neighbours Bangladesh at 99, China at 106, Nepal at 117, Sri Lanka at 122, Bhutan at 124 and Pakistan at 145.
- Iceland (93.5%) is again ranked first and has been leading the index for a decade and a half.

- The UNEP has released a report named "Raising Ambition, Accelerating Action: Towards Enhanced NDCs for Forests".
- This report highlights significant gaps in forest protection in current Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs).






- From 2019-2023, the tropical deforestation emitted 5.6 billion tonnes of CO2 annually in the top 20 countries.
- Only 8 countries have quantified deforestation targets, and just 38% of UNFCCC Parties include forest conversion reduction measures.
- ✤ Agriculture and weak land-use policies are major deforestation drivers.

World Blood Donor Day 2024 - June 14



- It aims to raise awareness about the importance of donating blood and supporting communities.
- ♦ It is celebrated on the birthday anniversary of Karl Landsteiner (June 14, 1868).





- Landsteiner was awarded the Nobel Prize for his discovery of the ABO blood group system.
- The theme of this year's is 20 years of celebrating giving: thank you blood donors.

Global Wind Day 2024 - June 15

- It aims to raise awareness about the importance of wind energy and its power to alter the globe.
- It is an effort to promote the use of wind energy as a sustainable and renewable source of energy.
- ✤ The first Wind Day was celebrated in 2007 by the European Wind Energy Association (EWEA).



World Elder Abuse Awareness Day 2024 - June 15



 It aims to encourage world to pay greater attention to the well-being and adequate health care of older people.





- Between 2019 and 2030, the number of persons aged 60 years or over is projected to grow by 38%, from 1 billion to 1.4 billion.
- ✤ Theme for 2024 is: Spotlight on Older Persons in Emergencies.
