TNPSC BITS

- ❖ India and France have been elected as the President and Co-President of the International Solar Alliance (ISA) for a two-year term from 2024 to 2026.
- ❖ Coal India Ltd (CIL), under the Ministry of Coal, marked its 50th Foundation Day on 1st November at its headquarters in Kolkata.
- ❖ The 352nd Governing Body meeting of the International Labour Organisation (ILO) is underway in Geneva.
- ❖ Collins Dictionary has declared "brat" (The album title that became a summer-living ideal) its 2024 word of the year.
- ❖ Yang Ji-in of Republic of Korea and Liu Yukun of China have been awarded the ISSF Athlete of the Year 2024.
- ❖ DBS Bank India has been recognised as one of the Best Companies for Women in India (BCWI) 2024 for the ninth successive year.

TAMIL NADU

RC Morris Report and Kodo Millet



❖ While investigating the mysterious deaths of 10 elephants within 72 hours in Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve, Madhya Pradesh forest department officials have come across R.C. Morris report.





- ❖ It is a 90-year-old report dated May 22, 1934 detailing the deaths of 14 elephants in Vannathiparai Reserve Forest, Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ It attributes the deaths of these elephants to the consumption of Kodo millet, locally known as 'Varagu.'
- ❖ The antidote for this poison is believed to be tamarind water or buttermilk in large quantities.
- ❖ The incident was recounted on December 17, 1933.
- ❖ The same kind of millet is now being linked to the recent elephant fatalities in Bandhavgarh, Madhya Pradesh.

Senna spectabilis in Tamil Nadu



- ❖ The Tamil Nadu government has informed the Madras High Court that the forests of the state would be made free of one of the invasive weeds Senna spectabilis by the next 12 months.
- ❖ It was introduced to the Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve (NBR) after being sourced from South and Central America.
- ❖ It is a fast-growing species, particularly on deep soils, and is fire- and termiteresistant and tolerant of strongly acidic soils.





❖ In November 2021, the Tamil Nadu Policy on Invasive Plants and Ecological Restoration (TNPIPER) experts found 196 alien invasive plant species in forest areas, of which 23 were 'priority invasives'.

NATIONAL

First in the World Challenge

- ❖ The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has announced a new initiative called "First in the World Challenge".
- ❖ It is aimed at encouraging Indian scientists to come up with innovative ideas for finding solutions to difficult health problems.
- ❖ The proposals aiming for 'incremental knowledge' or 'process innovation' will not be funded through this scheme.



DICSC project

- ❖ The Centre launched the Digital India Common Service Center (DICSC) project, in Pilibhit and Gorakhpur in Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ This initiative will establish one model DICSC center in nearly all gram panchayats across 10 districts, totalling 4,740 centers nationwide.
- ❖ The implementation and centralized technical monitoring of these centers will be managed by CSC e-Governance Services India Limited.





❖ It aims to create an integrated platform that provides essential e-governance services along with financial and commercial services to rural citizens.



National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan 2024



- ❖ India's updated National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP) 2024 was released at the 16th meeting of the Conference of Parties (COP 16), Colombia.
- ❖ It is a vital roadmap to address the strategies to halt and reverse biodiversity loss by 2030, with a longer-term vision of living in harmony with nature by 2050.
- ❖ India had adopted the 'Whole-of-Government' and 'Whole-of-Society' approach in updating its NBSAP.
- ❖ India commits to protect at least 30% of its terrestrial, inland water, and coastal and marine areas and the loss of highly biodiverse areas is close to zero by 2030.
- ❖ India, recognised as one of the 17 megadiverse countries, became a party to the CBD in 1994.
- ❖ It harbours about 7-8% of the world's recorded species within just 2.4% of the global land area.





- ❖ India is home to more than 55,000 plant taxa and over 100,000 species of animals.
- ❖ First NBSAP was created in 1999.

INTERNATIONAL

ARIN-AP

- ❖ India, represented by the Directorate of Enforcement (ED), has been included in the Steering Committee of the Asset Recovery Interagency Network-Asia Pacific (ARIN-AP).
- ❖ It is a prominent multi-agency network dedicated to tackling the proceeds of crime in the Asia-Pacific region and a member of the Global CARIN Network.
- ❖ India will assume the presidency of the network and host the Annual General Meeting (AGM) in 2026.
- ARIN-AP was established to facilitate cross-border collaboration on asset tracing, freezing, and confiscation.
- ❖ It includes 28 member jurisdictions and nine observers and serves as an informal yet robust network as part of CARIN Network.




Flash floods in Spain

- The Spanish city of Barcelona was hit by flood due to torrential rains.
- ❖ The flooding was caused by a Dana phenomenon when warm, moist air meets cold air, creating an unstable weather system.
- ❖ This is the Europe's worst flood-related disaster since 1967 when at least 500 people died in Portugal.





❖ The extreme weather event came after Spain battled with prolonged droughts in 2022 and 2023.



SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Analogue Space Mission - Leh




❖ ISRO has started the country's first analog space mission at Leh in Ladakh, where space agency will simulate life in an interplanetary habitat.





- ❖ The move assumes significance as India is planning to send a human to the Moon in the near future.
- ❖ Analog space missions are field tests in locations on Earth that have physical similarities to the extreme space environments.
- ❖ It also plays a significant role in problem solving for spaceflight research.

Luminescent Nanomaterials



- ❖ The Institute of Nano Science and Technology (INST), have developed a novel security ink using luminescent nanomaterials.
- ❖ It aims to combat counterfeiting in currency, certificates, branded goods, and medicines.
- ❖ This ink exhibits different colors under various light wavelengths, enhancing its security features.
- ❖ The synthesis process involves rare earth doping and a co-precipitation method, allowing the ink to remain effective under diverse conditions.
- ❖ This new innovation provides a reliable solution for verifying authenticity and preventing counterfeit products.


Rise of Himalayan Glacial Lakes

- ❖ The Himalayan glacial lakes are rapidly expanding posing an increasing threat to communities and ecosystems.
- ❖ From 2011 to 2024, these lakes grew by 10.81% in surface area, driven primarily by climate change.





- ❖ In India side, glacial lakes expanded by 33.7% over the same period.
- ❖ 67 lakes in India alone have seen a more than 40% increase in size, marking them as high-risk for potential flooding.
- ❖ Glacial lakes in India expanded from approximately 1,962 hectares in 2011 to 2,623 hectares by 2024.
- ❖ Across the entire Himalayan range, the surface area of glacial lakes grew from 533,401 hectares in 2011 to 591,108 hectares by 2024.



STATES

Thadou Tribe - 10 points declaration



- ❖ The Thadou tribes released a 10-point declaration to protect the tribe's distinct identity and heritage amid the ethnic crisis in Manipur.
- ❖ Thadou Convention have agreed to place a demand for recognition of the Thadou tribe as a separate and distinct Scheduled Tribe in Assam, Mizoram, and Nagaland.





- ❖ As per the declaration, Thadou is not Kuki, or underneath Kuki, or part of Kuki, but a separate, independent entity from Kuki.
- ❖ Thadou is one of the original 29 native/indigenous tribes of Manipur, India.
- ❖ It has been the single-largest tribe in Manipur consistently since the first census of India in 1881 till the latest census in 2011 that recorded Thadou population at 2,15,913.
- ❖ Any Kuki Tribes (AKT) had a population of 28,342 in the latest Manipur census in 2011, the first time Kuki was ever recorded in a census.
