TNPSC BITS

- ❖ An integrated coir cluster is expected to become operational in the Coimbatore district in January 2025.
- ❖ International Ancient Arts Festival and Symposium was held in New Delhi.
- ❖ The Union Bank of India has launched five Nari Shakti branches in Bengaluru, Chennai, Visakhapatnam, and Jaipur to empowering women entrepreneurs by offering credit, skill development, advisory services, networking opportunities.
- ❖ The 12th session of the World Urban Forum (WUF12) was held in Cairo, Capital of Egypt.
- ❖ Freedom fighter Madan Mohan Somtiya, a warrior of Mewar Praja Mandal, from Rajasthan passed away recently.
- The Legendary sarangi player Pandit Ram Narayan from Maharashtra, a recipient of the prestigious Padma Vibhushan and Sangeet Natak Akademi Award passed away recently.
- ❖ Armenia has become the first country to procure India's domestically developed Pinaka multiple rocket launcher system.

TAMIL NADU

Initiatives to support start-up ecosystem



- ❖ Tamil Nadu government has launched initiatives that would help the start-up ecosystem in the State.
- ❖ The first was the Periyar Social Justice Venture Lab.





- ❖ This will provide dedicated advisory, coaching, and acceleration programme for social enterprises, climate action initiatives, and SC/ST start-up founders at both pre-investment and post-investment stages.
- The another was Thozhil Nayam.
- ❖ It is a design studio that aims to empower direct-to-consumer (D2C) start-ups in the State by having successful listings on e-commerce platforms.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu has recently established the Global Startup Coordination Centre in Dubai.
- ❖ Similar centres will soon be established in Singapore and the United States.
- ❖ The State also sponsored 19 start-up companies from Tamil Nadu to take part in the prestigious GITEX event held in Dubai recently.

Measures to ensure student safety

- ❖ A new Student Safeguarding Advisory Committee (SSAC) has been ordered to be established in every school across the State.
- ❖ The SSAC will meet monthly to address concerns or complaints related to student welfare.
- ❖ The School Education Department placing toll-free helpline numbers 14417 and 1098 — on the back covers of textbooks is one among the various key initiatives.
- ❖ These numbers will help students to anonymously report incidents of sexual harassment or other unsafe activities.





❖ Schools are also instructed to install complaint boxes — labelled as Maanavar Manasu — where students can submit their grievances in a confidential manner.

NATIONAL

National MSME Cluster Outreach Program

- ❖ The Centre launched a national programme to promote financial access for micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs).
- ❖ A cluster is a group of enterprises located in an identifiable and, as far as practicable, contiguous area and producing similar products and services.
- This will support the sustainability and growth of MSEs by addressing common issues such as technology, skill and quality improvement, market access, access to capital etc.




Renewable Energy Growth and Investment 2024

- ❖ India's total renewable energy capacity increased by 13.5 per cent or 24.2 GW in a year to reach at 203.18 GW in October 2024.
- ❖ It was 178.98 GW in October 2023.
- ❖ Including nuclear energy, the total non-fossil fuel capacity rose to 211.36 GW in 2024, compared to 186.46 GW in 2023.
- ❖ The solar sector saw a remarkable increase of 20.1 GW (27.9 per cent).
- ❖ It was growing from 72.02 GW in October 2023 to 92.12 GW in October 2024.






- ❖ The combined total solar capacity, including projects under implementation and tendered, now stands at 250.57 GW.
- ❖ This is a significant rise from 166.49 GW last year.
- ❖ Installed capacity of Wind energy increases by 7.8 per cent, from 44.29 GW in October 2023 to 47.72 GW in 2024.



WIPO Patent Filings 2023 - India



❖ India's patents and industrial filings are doubled between 2018 and 2023 while trademarks grew 60%.





- ❖ The country now ranks 6th globally with 64,480 patent filings, up 15.7%.
- ❖ India's IP (intellectual property) office is the second highest globally in the trademarks, with 3.2 million registrations in 2023.
- ❖ The country's Patent-to-GDP ratio surged to 381 from 144 over the past decade.
- ❖ India ranks 4th globally in trademark filings, up by 6.1% in 2023 with nearly 90% from residents
- ❖ India moved up to 10th globally for industrial design filings with a 36.4% increase in 2023.

INTERNATIONAL

Russia's Pantsir System



- ❖ India signs deal with Russia to facilitate cooperation for variants of the advanced Pantsir air defence missile-gun system.
- ❖ It aims to explore new avenues for manufacturing, technology transfer, and joint development of the Pantsir variants.
- ❖ The Pantsir air defence system is a highly versatile and mobile platform designed to protect military installations and critical infrastructure from aerial threats.
- ❖ It was including aircraft, drones, and precision-guided munitions.
- ❖ The system combines short- to medium-range surface-to-air missiles with dual 30mm automatic cannons.
- ❖ The Pantsir can detect and engage the targets up to 36 kilometres away and at altitudes of up to 15 kilometres





❖ The Pantsir system's adaptability for the different terrains and its capability to counter multiple aerial threats simultaneously.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

New Cyanobacteria Strain - Chonkus

- * Researchers discovered a unique strain of cyanobacteria, known as Chonkus.
- ❖ This strain was discovered in the volcanic ocean vents near Vulcano, Italy.
- ❖ Chonkus exhibits rapid growth in CO2-rich waters.
- ❖ It has a natural tendency to sink, which aids in carbon capture.




Break down 'Biofilm Barriers'

- ❖ A team of scientists at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) has devised a way to break down 'biofilm barriers' to aid entry of drugs.
- ❖ Most of the disease-causing bacteria secrete the matrix-like layers around themselves called biofilms.
- ❖ These biofilms act as thick barriers, limiting the entry of drugs, and helping the bacteria become resistant to antibiotics.
- ❖ To break down this biofilm barrier, the team has used an enzyme from the cow's digestive tract.
- ❖ The bovine gut harbours microbial enzymes that digest different kinds of complex polysaccharides, such as cellulose and hemicellulose.





❖ They found glycoside hydrolases (GH)-B2 successfully broke down biofilms in various lab conditions.



Bio-derived Foam



- * Researchers at IISc Bengaluru have developed an innovative and eco-friendly bio-derived foam.
- ❖ The foam is made from bio-based epoxy resins, made from non-edible oils and hardeners derived from tea leaves.





❖ This reduces reliance on the fossil fuels and non-recyclable materials while maintaining the foam's excellent compressive strength.

ENVIRONMENT

UNFCCC COP 29



- ❖ The 2024 United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP29) kicked off in Baku, Azerbaijan.
- ❖ The primary goal of COP29 is to bring together countries to develop a shared plan for curbing further global warming.
- ❖ It will also focus on scaling up climate finance to help developing nations tackle the adverse effects of climate change.
- ❖ The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), an international treaty, was signed in 1992.
- ❖ In COP3 at Kyoto (Japan) in 1997, the parties adopted the Kyoto Protocol.
- ❖ At COP21 in Paris, 196 parties adopted the landmark Paris Agreement, a legally binding international treaty.
- ❖ During COP26 in Glasgow 2021 the Glasgow Pact was accepted.
- At COP28 in Dubai, a Loss and Damage fund was officially launched.

Fire-Resilient Plant

- ❖ Scientists have discovered a new fire-resilient plant species in India's Northern Western Ghats.
- ❖ They have named the species as 'Dicliptera polymorpha'.





- ❖ The new species experiences a burst of flowering, triggered through grassland fires.
- ❖ This species is notable for its fire-resilient, pyrophytic habit as well as the unique dual-blooming pattern.

REPORTS AND INDICES

World Intellectual Property Indicators (WIPI) 2024

- ❖ WIPI 2024 published by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).
- ❖ Globally, over 35 lakh patents were filed, with China leading at 1.64 million.
- ❖ It is followed by the USA, Japan, South Korea, and Germany.
- ❖ India stands sixth, ahead of Germany, with a consistent rise in patent activity.
- ❖ The Global patent filings are increased by 15.7% in 2023, the 4th consecutive year of positive growth.
- ❖ Asia accounted for 68.7% of global patent filings, 66.7% of trademark filings, and 69% of industrial design filings in 2023.

❖ London topped the list of the top 100 "city brands" for the second consecutive year.





- ❖ It is followed by New York, Paris, Tokyo, Dubai, Singapore, Los Angeles, Sydney, San Francisco, and Amsterdam.
- ❖ This was based on a survey of 15,000 people across 20 countries.
- ❖ Dubai has emerged as the highest-ranked city in West Asia and Africa.

Seaplane service - Kerala



- * Kerala launched Seaplane service to connect various place with airports.
- ❖ Water dromes may also be established around major water bodies in all districts.
- ❖ The seaplane service comes under the Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS)-UDAN.
- ❖ It aims to enhance connectivity across Kerala's four airports and backwaters, offering subsidised fares.
- ❖ A trial run was conducted between Bolgatty water drome at Kochi Lake and Mattupetty dam at Munnar.


World Pneumonia Day 2024 - November 12

❖ It aims to raise awareness about pneumonia, a life-threatening but preventable and treatable respiratory illness.






- ❖ It was established in 2009 by the Global Coalition against Child Pneumonia.
- ❖ The theme for 2024 is "Every Breath Counts: Stop Pneumonia in Its Track."
- ❖ In 2019, 25 lakhs people lost their lives, and around seven lakhs' children below five years died due to the Pneumonia across the world.



Public Service Broadcasting Day 2024 - November 12



❖ The day highlights the vital role of Akashvani in informing, educating, and promoting cultural diversity across the nation.





- ❖ This day commemorate the only visit of MK Gandhi to the Akashvani station in Delhi in 1947.
- ❖ He addressed the displaced people, who had temporarily settled at Kurukshetra in Haryana after partition.
- ❖ The day was officially declared as Public Service Broadcasting Day in 2001.

- ❖ IIT Ropar have unveiled an innovative solution to make continuous passive motion (CPM) therapy more accessible and affordable.
