1. Write about The Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Bill, 2017

Definition:

- (i) Bill also known as Triple talaq bill
- (ii) Triple talaq is a practice by which Muslim men divorce their wives by uttering 'talaq' thrice, over a period of three months.

Origin:

In the Saira Bano case (2017) - Triple Talaq including Talaq-e-biddat,

- (i) Violates Article 14 (Equality), and
- (ii) Not an essential religious practice of Islam, so no protection under Article 25 (Religious freedom).
- So, Supreme Court directed parliament for legislation

Objectives of the bill:

- (i) Ensure constitutional goals of gender justice
- (ii) Ensures gender equality of married Muslim women
- (iii) Subserve their fundamental rights of non-discrimination
- (iv) Empowers women

Features of Bill:

- (i) Declaration of Talaq which results in instant and irrevocable divorce in any form, (written or electronic) is unconstitutional, illegal and void.
- (ii) **Offence and penalty:** It makes declaration of talaq a cognizable and non-bailable offence (Imprisonment upto 3 years along with fine).
- (iii) **Allowance:** Affected Muslim women can get allowance from her husband for herself and for her children. First Class Magistrate will decide this allowance amount.
- (iv) **Custody of minor children:** First Class Magistrate will make determination of custody of her minor children.







2. Write the objectives of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan or Clean India Campaign.

- (i) Nationwide campaign and biggest ever cleanliness drive in the country.
- (ii) The goal is to achieve Swachh Bharat by 2019, as a tribute to the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, by improving the levels of cleanliness in rural areas and making Gram Panchayats Open Defecation Free (ODF).

(iii) Specific Objectives:

- a. Elimination of open defecation.
- b. Conversion of insanitary toilets to pour flush toilets.
- c. Eradication of manual scavenging.
- d. 100% collection and scientific processing/disposal/reuse/recycling of municipal solid waste.
- e. A behavioral change in people regarding healthy sanitation practices
- f. Generation of awareness among citizens about sanitation and its linkages with public health.
- g. Supporting urban local bodies in designing, executing and operating waste disposal systems.
- h. Facilitating private-sector participation in capital expenditure and operation and maintenance costs for sanitary facilities.

- (iii) A parent or legal guardian can open an account in the name of the girl child until she attains the age of ten years.
- (iv) She can withdraw 50% of the money after reaching age of 18 e.g. for higher education. 18 years deadline will also help preventing child-marriages.
- (v) The annual deposit (contributions) qualifies for Section 80C benefit and the maturity benefits are non-taxable.
- (vi) It would prevent early marriages of girl and ensure equitable share to a girl child in resources and savings of a family in which she is generally discriminated as against a male child

b. STREE SWABHIMAN - Explain

- (i) Under this project, sanitary napkin micro manufacturing units (semi-automatic and manual process production unit) are being setup at CSCs across India, particularly those operated by women entrepreneurs.
- (ii) The product (sanitary napkin) will be sold under the "Swabhimaan" brand name and the Organization with the help of Village Level Entrepreneur (VLEs) and SHG groups will obtain the trade license for marketing the sanitary napkins at a subsidized rate.
- (iii) It also has a menstrual hygiene related awareness generation component and aims to increase usage of sanitary napkins among rural girls in schools and colleges by making the napkins available to almost 1,000 girls in the primary and secondary schools in their village, encompassing girls from 7th to 12th grade.
- (iv) CSC SPV will try to raise funds to provide sanitary pads to girl students in Rural Areas of Country free of cost.
